Notes from the Council — May 2025

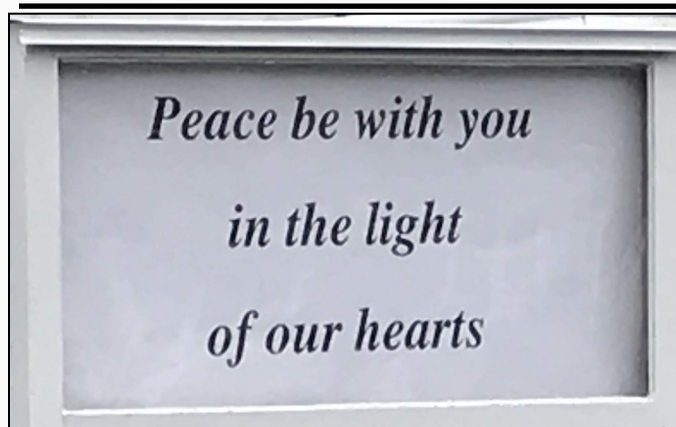

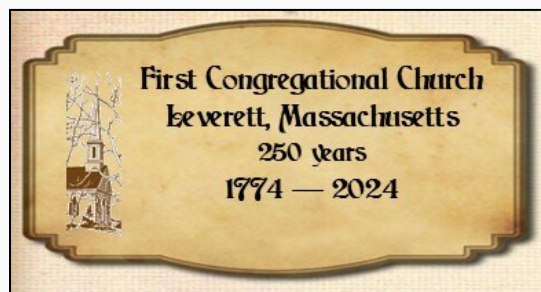

Letter from Lee

Pastor

Dear LCC Community,

After a long winter, what a blessing it is to receive the Spring. The light, the warmth, the growing green, the flowers... I yearn to breathe it all in... to *dance* with the beauty.

Glorying in the beauty of Spring can help us deepen our sacred relationships with God and each other. As the Franciscan monk Richard Rohr has written, "The energy in the universe is not in the planets or in the protons or neutrons, but in the relationship between them.... Not in the cells of organisms but in the way the cells feed and give feedback to one another.... This is where all the power for infinite renewal is at work: The loving relationship between them. The infinite love flowing between them. The dance itself."

Rohr uses this image of Spirit-as-function in a powerful portrayal of the Christian Trinity. He describes The Holy Spirit as the energy of love... of life... flowing from the Creator to the creation, which is Christ, the incarnation of God.

As we breathe in the beauty of Spring while pursuing our daily lives, we can seek to deepen our awareness of the blessing... to realize we are receiving divine energy in a particularly beautiful form. And then we can choose to share this beauty through loving action. Perhaps we pick a few flowers for someone who needs them. Perhaps the sight of a flowering tree lights a smile inside us, and we share that smile with a stranger on the street. Perhaps we offer to help a homebound get outside for a bit.

Whatever rhythms work for us in the beauty of this springtime dance, may we share them with many partners, and so may we bring joy to all.

making plans to address maintenance of the garden on the King Lot and the rest of the property (e.g., removing dead/dying trees and clearing undergrowth along Montague Road). We expect to start this type of work soon.

Lee had a discussion with one of our recent church attendees about a summer camp scholarship for her child. In the past, when we had more young people in the congregation, we offered scholarships for children to attend a spiritual summer camp, with many attending youth retreats at Star Island (New Hampshire). The scholarship would pay 50% of the cost to attend.

Our Town Hall connection — In 1895, Town Meeting granted the church permission to improve the Town Hall. The church Ladies' Benevolent Society thereupon raised nearly \$700 to raise the Town Hall and construct an entry, dining hall and kitchen as the new first floor. In 1921 the Ladies Benevolent Society contributed \$100 toward an eastern addition to the Town Hall, adding the fireplace room on the first floor and a stage on the second floor; the Grange likewise contributed \$100, and the town paid the balance for the total \$513 cost of the addition. ***Not until 1969 did the town decide to create offices in the town hall.*** The church, with permission from the town, continues to use the downstairs space for coffee hours, receptions and other social events. In the past, the church put on popular chicken pie Suppers.
