

to Christmas. Other calendars are more elaborate and may contain figures or candy treats. Gordon opened the door one day and I had the next, so we each had 12 doors to open.

This year, last Sunday (November 30) was the first Sunday of Advent and we lit the first candle – the Candle of Hope. The reading was particularly relevant this year, given the turmoil around the world: “Isaiah the Prophet foretold the birth of Christ, one who would herald a new era of peace, where the wolf would lie down with the lamb; an era of justice, where no one would go hungry, and all would be treated with dignity and fairness.” What a wonderful world it would be if everyone followed this path.

We’ll be lighting the Candle of Peace on Sunday, December 7, followed by the Candle of Joy (on the 14<sup>th</sup>) and the Candle of Joy (on the 21<sup>st</sup>). Reverend Alice Goodwin-Brown will lead our service for the next two Sundays and Reverend Randall (Randy) Hyvonen will finish the month for us, including the Candlelight Service on Tuesday, December 23.

I spoke with Lee today and he is doing much better...still a bit tired and lacking stamina, but he is getting stronger every day. He emphasized that he is really looking forward to returning to the pulpit in January. Again, he expressed his sincere gratitude to the church for giving him time to recuperate.

We’re looking forward to seeing you either in person or on Zoom during this holiday season. In the meantime, God bless all of you, your family and friends. May we all make the world a better place through our thoughts, words, deeds, and prayers.


